(b) Exempt Banks

12. The Department does not control any designated exempt banks.

(c) Use and Disclosure

13. As the Department of External Affairs controls only a limited number of Personal Information Banks, the implementation of the new Use and Disclosure code with respect to personal information has not been a problem. All banks and classes of personal information are reviewed twice annually as part of the process of producing departmental contributions to the Personal Information Index and Bulletin.
