The Chairman: Order, please. Will hon. members resume their seats. I understand the hon. member for Cape Breton-East Richmond is rising on a question of privilege.

Mr. MacInnis (Cape Breton-East Richmond): Mr. Chairman, I rise on a point of order because of the attempt made to table the document to which the hon. member referred. I draw Your Honour's attention to the fact that since this was not received by the chair, or properly tabled, and if such a document is to be tabled, similar figures should be provided by that hon. member for each and every province in the country.

Mr. Perrault: Mr. Chairman—

The Chairman: Order, please. I am advising the committee that the document was not tabled.

Mr. Perrault: I simply want to say that I premeditated the member's request. I had made statistics available to the table relating to every province in Canada, including British Columbia, Ontario and Saskatchewan, Alberta and all the rest. The facts are available.

An hon. Member: You haven't had a valid point of privilege for five years.

The Chairman: Order, please. May I suggest to the committee that I think the suggestion by the hon. member for Egmont was a reasonable one.
