FULL INDEXATION OF FAMILY ALLOWANCES AND CHILD TAX CREDIT

Mr. Sergio Marchi (York West): Mr. Speaker, I have two petitions to present from my riding of York West. One was collected by Mr. Pio Bertoia and the other one was collected by Mr. Nizio Daneluzzi. Both petitions ask the Government and the Prime Minister (Mr. Mulroney) to restore full indexation to the family allowance and indicate that this regressive budget measure will take away some \$55 million.

I have also received a number of petitions in my office from the ridings of Montreal-Mercier, Saint-Jean, Saint-Michel, Montreal-Sainte-Marie and Rosemont, in the Quebec region, as well as from the riding of Victoria in our great Province of British Columbia and from Saint-Hyacinthe.
