My dear Colonel Bovey:

Replying to your letter of the 10th instant, it is a pleasure to be able to inform you that Professor W. V. Howard, whom I presume is either a native Canadian or a domiciled British subject, is in the non-quota class,

If he is a native Canadian, that fact would make him non-quota. If he is a British subject domiciled in Canada he is non-quota, provided, of course, he has been a professor for two years. If he is not a native Canadian a letter from General Sir Arthur Currie stating that he has been a professor or a teacher for two years would enable me to grant him a visa, subject, of course, to his being in good enough health to pass the Immigration Officers.
