Dear Sir Arthur:

Lemesurier has written me about fees, sending me a statement of charge to general funds and proposed new fee for each Faculty. I note that the charge to general funds per law student is only ~~\$8.33~~ <sup>no. #490</sup> ~~\$8.33~~. The only basis for so large an increase in our case as from \$205 to \$300 must therefore be improved course or improved facilities of some kind. In general I should be strongly in favour of improving instruction and charging higher fees, and if the University feels ready to go ahead at once with the appointment of a professor of comparative law as a fourth full-time member of Faculty I see no objection to increasing the fees now. He may have fewer students, but in view of the crowded condition of the profession that is probably no serious loss. He might even meet the objection of stopping the poor but worthy
