

Dear Sir Arthur:-

With further reference to your last communication regarding a committee of seven to be appointed for the selection of teachers for McGill University.

This question was discussed at length at our regular Board of Management meeting held on the 2nd instant, and I can assure you was given a most sympathetic hearing; but as the questions involved are of such a serious nature to the future policy of this hospital, especially, it was considered advisable that a larger committee than formerly should meet with you again, in the hope that this question may be amicably and satisfactorily settled for both the University and the hospitals: and to this end it was resolved that a committee composed of Colonel Herbert Molson, C.E. Neill, Senator Smeaton White, Dr. Haywood and Dr. C.F. Martin, should meet with you in the very near future, and it was further suggested that Colonel Molson would consult with you with a view to inviting two or three other Governors of McGill University not directly connected with either hospital. If this meets with your approval a meeting had better be arranged as soon as possible.
