From the Port Hope Warder, 19th May, 1835.

Last year, after that dreadful malady, the cholera, had subsided in the City of Toronto, a number of the most respectable citizens assembled at the Court-House for the purpose of testifying their due sense of the christian zeal and unceasing exertions of the Venerable Archdeacon during the prevalence of cholera in that City in 1832 and 34. At the meeting referred to, it was resolved that a suitable piece of Plate be presented to Dr. Strachan, and a committee was appointed to carry the resolution into effect; directions were given by the Committee to Mr. Stennett, Jeweller and Silver-Smith, King-Street, to make the same. The Toronto Patriot and Courier gives a description of the Vase and its presentation on the 10th instant.

On presenting the Vase, an appropriate address was read, to which the Archdeacon gave a feeling and affectionate reply.
