SUPPLY OF SWINE SHOWS DECREASE

West Exported Heavily to the U. S. When War Broke Out.

INCREASE IN HORSES

Number of Cattle, Apart From Milch Cows, Also Larger.

OTTAWA, Aug. 16.—The numbers of farm live stock in Canada at June 30, 1915, were as follows:
Horses, 2,996,099; milch cows, 2,666,846; other cattle, 3,389,155; all cattle, 6,056,001; sheep, 2,038,642; swine, 3,111,900. As compared with 1914, these figures represent increases of 48,361 horses; 36,624 other cattle; and 29,154, all cattle, but decreases of 6440 milch cows; 19,383 sheep; and 322,361 swine. Notwithstanding the large and sudden exportation of farm animals, the numbers in Canada are being fairly well maintained. The large decrease in the numbers of swine, with a correspondingly large exportation to the United States, applies principally to Alberta, where, owing to the increased cost of grain stuffs caused by the war, swine feeding became unprofitable, large numbers of swine being thrown upon the market last fall.

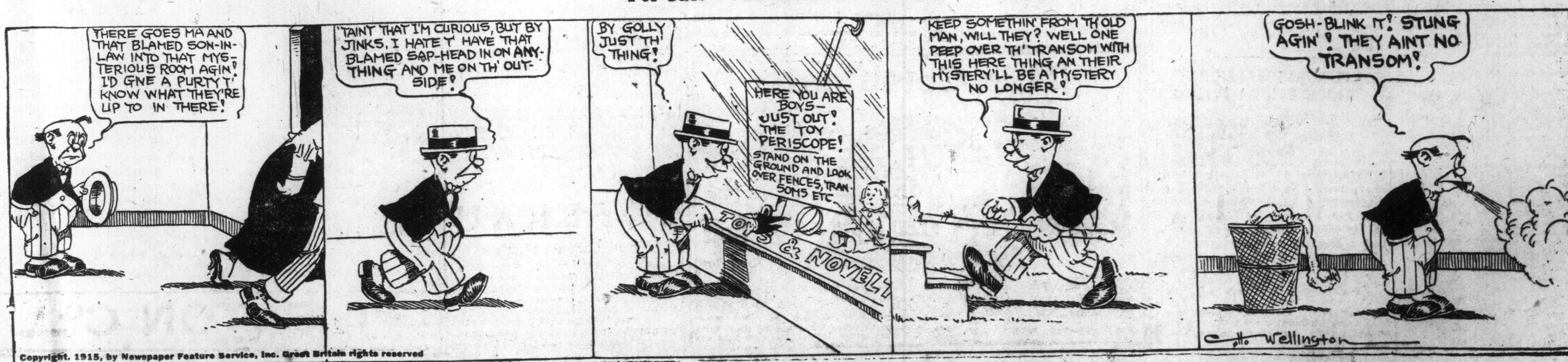

TWO FAVORITES WIN AT HILLCREST PARK

Kentucky Horse, Geo. Stoll, Broke Leg in Fifth Race and Was Destroyed.

The running of the fifth race at Hillcrest Park yesterday afternoon was marred by an accident. George Stoll, the Kentucky-owned horse, making his first appearance at the local track under the colors of F. Geraghty, fell and broke his leg, and had to be destroyed by the track veterinarian. George Stoll was a 5-year-old gelding by Staturium—Lucy Lockett. Little Ep had the rail position, and when the horses swung out of the backstretch, Caldwell, on Star O'Ryan, cut across and bumped Little Ep and George Stoll and both horses went down. Irish Kid fell over George Stoll. Jockeys Foden, Cullen and Dominick, the respective riders, ascended unhurt and finished out their engagements.

Favorites won two of the eight races, Golden Ruby the second and Alouette the last. Cullen and Boyle each rode two firsts.

Premier Pays Glowing Tribute in Letter to General Alderson.

OTTAWA, Ont., Aug. 16.—A portion of a letter received by General Alderson, commanding the first Canadian division, from Sir Robert Borden on July 30 last has been incorporated in divisional orders for all to see and read. It says:

"The fine spirit of the Canadian division," says Sir Robert, "and their evident efficiency for the great task in which they are engaged very deeply impressed me. It was a great privilege to have the opportunity of seeing them and of conveying to them from the people of Canada a message of pride and appreciation. As I said on more than one occasion in addressing the officers and men, they can hardly realize how intensely all Canada has been thrilled by the tidings of their achievements."

"The president of the French republic, as well as General Joffre and Sir John French, spoke of the troops under your command in terms of the highest praise."

"I bid you godspeed in the great task in which you are engaged."
