Vandal, Point April 26.—Altho German picked divisions advanced yesterday morning all along the line between Wytschaete and Bailieul, the brunt of their attacks was directed against a small sector of the allied line a little west of Wytschaete. So heavy was the pressure from the overwhelming number of troops that the desenders were forced tack. Into this gap the Germans flung fresh infantry, which started a turning movement downward about Mount Kemmel. The French, who were defending the hill, fell back slowly, contesting every yard of ground furiously.

The battle was at close quariers. The Germans continued to suffer cyrible casuakties. The shell-torn slopes of: the hill were strewn with the dead. The French were still in their positions on the hill when evening came, altho apparently they were surrounded. If any of them were able to hold on thru the night, and had ammunition left, their assistance must have meant much to their compades who counter-attacked this morning. In consequence of the German push about Mount Kemmel it became necessary to draw back the allied line somewhat on either side of the hill.
