The maximum height of the flood was two feet over the flood of 1902, and to-night it is practically maintained.
The dam confining the waters of Pompton Lake, N.J., burst. The iron bridge across the Ramapo River was carried away, and a hundred houses be-low it were partly submerged. The en-gine room of the Pompton Iron and Steel Works was demolished. Pompton was isolated, as no trains could pass. The lake, which was empiled, was more than a mile long and half a mile wide.
Nearly all the cities in Northern New Jersey were partly flooded. Electric hight plants had to close, schools could not open and many houses were wreck-ed.
