Poland alone had four million children who had not on an average one loaf of bread per week. The inhabitants did not know what shoes were. In a certain town with a population of twenty thousand food had been promised by the American war relief committee. When a train pulled into the town the population gathered around, but to their horror the train contained clothes instead of food. The weather at that time was like that in Canada in the winter-time. The wails that went up were pitiful to hear when the people saw that they were not to get food after all.

The people of Jerusalem were prosperous prior to the war, but now they were in a condition similar to that of the people of other war-stricken countries. 


