On entering, each pupil is examined and placed in the different classes for which his previous acquirements have prepared him. Thus, a pupil who is, in most subjects, in the second class, may be in the First for Arithmetic, and in the Third, or even lower, for French. During the course of the year, any student judged competent for a higher class, may be promoted thereto.

The sum of class marks of each day is read once a week by the Principal to the assembled students Thus the conduct, application and standing of each student are made known in a manner eminently calculated to encourage progress in behaviour and knowledge, to reward the dutiful and studious, and to stimulate the remiss to praiseworthy emulation. At the end of each term, a report thereof is given to the student.

ADMISSION.

Students are admitted at any time during the scholastic year; nevertheless, the most favorable time for entering is at the beginning of each term, when requisite instruction preparatory to the introduction of new matters, or of more advanced part of matters already studied, is given in the different classes.
