### SILLS AND BOWERS IN NARROW ESCAPE

#### Screen Stars Near to Death During Making of an Ince Feature.

A double tragedy that would have robbed the shadow screen of two of its most popular leading men nearly occurred during the filming of Thomas H. Ince's "What a Wife Learned," showing at the Queen's Theatre. To get shots of a big scene at the climax of the play when John Bowers and Milton Sills, who are featured in the picture, are trapped by flood waters and swept over the spillway of a dam, the two actors climbed upon a temporary staging built just below the big Laguna Dam at Yuma, Arizona. At a given signal a dam structure which had been built for the filming of the sequence was destroyed by a rush of waters released from the dam and a flood tide swept on down to the lower site where Bowers and Sills were clinging to the staging. Both Bowers and Sills got the fright of their lives when a wall of water, forty feet high, bore down on them. The head of water from the gates to the scene described in the script became terrifyingly realistic. The two actors were thrown into the water with terrific force while even the cameramen on the side lines were knocked off their feet.

### RICHEST PRINCE OF INDIA DEAD

#### Gaekwar of Baroda Expires on Train Traveling in Holland.

Flushing, Holland, Aug. 27.—Maharaja Gaekwar of Baroda, said to be the richest prince in India, died here tonight on a journey from Berlin.

The Maharaja was taken ill on board the train and died just before reaching Flushing. During the Delhi Durbar in 1912 the Maharaja created a tremendous sensation by turning his back on King George at a reception, instead of walking backward, as is customary in the presence of royalty.

During the war, however, he proved among the most loyal of the Indian princes, giving great assistance to Great Britain.

The Maharaja of Baroda, 60 years old. He was a descendant of the famous Maharaja leader, Gamaji Gaekwar, who obtained from the Shah of Satara the title of Shansher Bahadur for bravery at the Battle of Balakur, fought against the Imperial forces of Delhi at the close of the seventeenth century.

The reign of the dead Maharaja was one of progress and prosperity. His state in India covers 8,182 square miles and contains a population of 2,120,000 souls. He was cultured and had written extensively on India.

### STATESMEN LEAVING FOR EMPIRE MEETS

#### London, Aug. 27.—Preparations for the Imperial Conference and the Imperial Economic Conference which are to be held in London in October simultaneously, are already well advanced and in the next few days several delegates from the Dominions will leave home on their way here.

Premier W. F. Massey, of New Zealand, and the other New Zealand delegates will sail from Auckland tomorrow.

Australia's delegation, which, it is said, will number more than 20, will sail from Melbourne on Saturday. Premier S. M. Bruce and Senator R. V. Wilson, Honorary Minister in the Commonwealth Government, will be accompanied by their wives.

Premier Jan Christian Smuts, of South Africa, will sail from Cape Town on Sept. 4 to attend the Imperial Conference. He is not carrying out his original intention of attending the League of Nations assembly at Geneva.


