

HOLD BILL FOR HEBRIDEANS IN WEST REPORTED DISAPPOINTED

Calgary, May 31.—Some disappointment has arisen at Red Deer over the non provision of free land for the Hebridean settlers who arrived in Canada a few weeks ago, says the Albertan.

The settlers say they were given promises of a refund on transportation, long term payment on land and other inducements. Following an investigation, the Albertan reproduces a letter, signed D. McIntyre, which tells of land and houses being available for the Hebrideans, long term farms and other inducements which are offered prospective settlers. The letter is held by Angus McLeod, one of the settlers.

McIntyre is said to be a brother of Rev. D. McIntyre, who has been acting as agent for the Hebrideans. Of the ninety men who arrived in Red Deer, May 8, there are still 76 unsettled, the newspaper asserts. Many haven't money to buy farms although a few have as much as \$5,000.
