TO INVESTIGATE  
STEAMER PROFITS

Ottawa, Ont., June 21.—The cost of living committee of the commons has decided to call the president, general manager and secretary of the Canada Steamships Lines to appear on Friday to give evidence regarding the stock of the company and the profits made during the last six years.

The committee this morning heard Ottawa coal dealers, the first witness being John J. Henry, at the conclusion of whose examination, H. H. Stevens, M. P., remarked: "There is a very creditable condition in Ottawa," and F. M. Lewis, M. P., said: "It seems to me that his profits are exceedingly reasonable and as the coal dealer has been made a butt in these matters, the public ought to know this."

Mr. Henry stated in July, 1918, stove and chestnut coal sold for cash at \$10.75, in August \$10.75, in September \$10.80, in October \$10.90, in November \$11.85, in April, 1919, \$11.85 and at the present time, \$11.10. The reason for the increase in cost and the higher price at the mine which was controlled by the United States government, the stiff exchange, the higher freight rates, and the increase of pay and shorter hours of the local employees. He said he had endeavored to keep the price down as low as possible and bought direct from the mines. The cost was lower than any other city in Canada the last five years and the citizens of Ottawa were better taken care of on anthracite than those of Toronto or Montreal. Coal here was sold at a lower margin of profit.

H. A. Pringle, K. C., also complimented Mr. Henry and the other local dealers in regard to the coal situation. The witness said that if there had been cold weather last winter there would have been a serious shortage. Conditions next winter would again largely depend upon the weather. Mr. Henry gave evidence and none were seriously hurt. A number of buildings in the vicinity suffered damage through the roof taking fire.

**Interim Report.**

Following the evidence of the Ottawa coal dealers, discussion arose on a suggestion by the chairman that an interim report should be presented to the house. The chairman intimated that he was preparing such a report regarding meat products and eggs.

"All evidence goes to show," he remarked, "that price regulation at the point of production would tend to dry up supply."

It was decided that the committee should meet at 10 a. m. Monday to consider the chairman's draft report.

There was also discussion whether Sir Joseph Flavelle should be called, as was decided some time ago. Mr. Nesbitt argued that Sir Joseph Flavelle could not give any evidence as to the details of the William Davies Company's business which the commission had not already in its possession. Mr. Devlin questioned, however, whether the public would be satisfied if the committee decided not to call Sir Joseph in view of his being popularly classed as a great profiteer. It was decided not to call Sir Joseph for the time being.

BIG FIRE IN QUEBEC

Quebec, June 22.—A fire which caused damage to the extent of about half a million dollars was discovered shortly before 5 o'clock this morning in the Terrasse & Racine block fronting on St. Paul, St. Thomas and St. Andrew streets. The building was used as a storehouse and show rooms for stores manufactured in the Terrasse & Racine foundry, which is in a separate building. Part of the building was occupied by the International Harvester Company and the building as well as the stock was a total loss. Owing to confined smoke and steam, caused by the water playing on the flames, an explosion occurred and the walls collapsed, falling out on the street and obstructing the car service for the greater part of the day. Several of the firemen suffered minor injuries but none were seriously hurt. A number of buildings in the vicinity suffered damage through the roof taking fire.

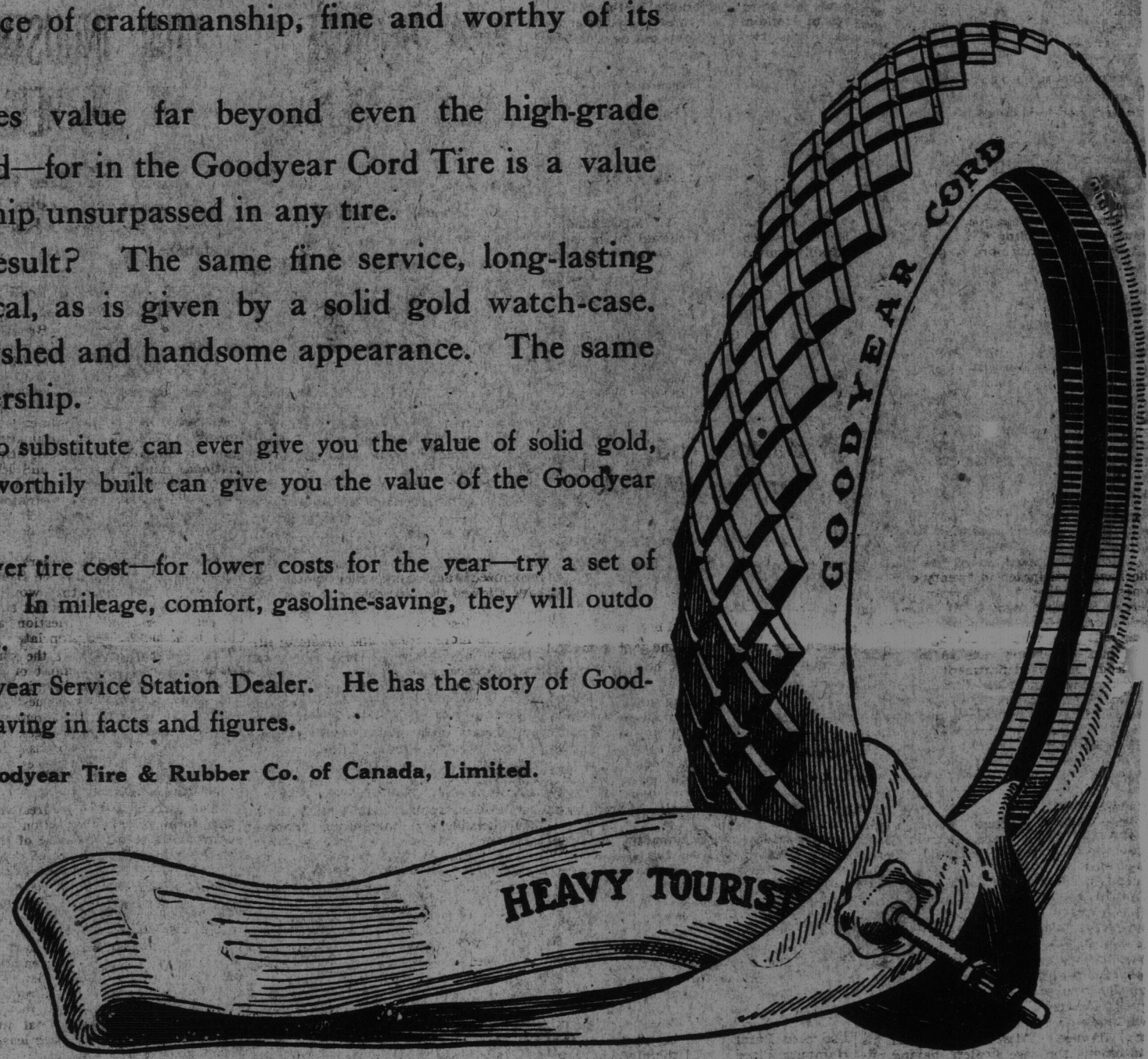

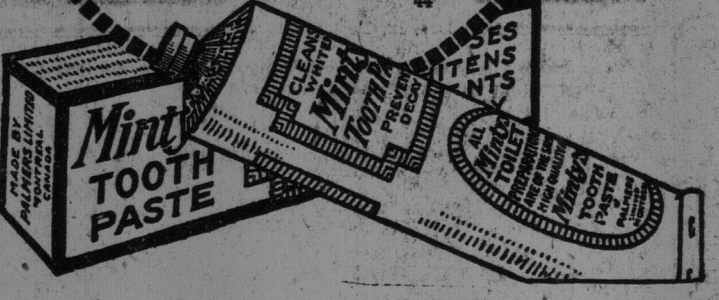

### Duke Now Chief of St. Regis Indians

Title "Great Father" Conferred on Governor-General at Cornwall

Cornwall, June 21.—The Duke and Duchess of Devonshire and party arrived here by special train and were given a cordial welcome by the citizens of the town and a large number of people from the surrounding district.

Mayor Fetterly and the members of the town council and prominent citizens were at the Grand Trunk station to meet the vice-regal party. Their excellencies and their party were then escorted to Central Park where addresses were read from the members of the council and Indians of St. Regis.

J. G. Harkness, town clerk, read the address from the town council and E. E. Tallon, collector of customs at St. Regis, one from the Indians. The Indians bestowed on his excellency an honor but rarely conferred upon the white man, that of adopting him as a member and creating him a chief of the St. Regis tribe of Indians. Henceforth to the tribe the duke will be known as Kan-gi-sko-we, which in English means the "Great Father." His excellency replied to both addresses.
