

with the possibilities for sheep protection and likewise with the progressive legislation that has been enacted for the protection and purchase of sheep by the department. While in Fredericton Mr. Stansfield visited the wool warehouse and expressed himself as being well pleased with the quantity and quality of the wool accumulated.

Some very important decisions affecting both the farmer and the breeder were arrived at. The federal department of agriculture is offering a bonus of \$5 a year for two years in succession to a farmer who will use a pure bred ram. This bonus applies to farmers who have never used one before. Mr. Tweeddale has given his assent to a provincial bonus of \$5 for the same purpose. It is anticipated that this bonus will be an incentive to the farmer for the purchase of more and better rams, as it will make up the difference between the purchase of more and better rams, as it will make up the difference between the purchase price of a pure-bred and a scrub. The motive is simply to demonstrate for two years the value of the pure bred sire versus the scrub, and if at the end of two years the farmer is convinced by concrete evidence—that is better lambs—then it is assumed that he will continue to use pure bred rams, but will receive no further bonus.

Another decision affecting the owners of grade flocks was arrived at, viz., that if a group of twenty-five farmers in any district or parish will get together and appoint a representative to purchase stock, the department of agriculture will pay his traveling expenses to any place east of Fort. William, Ontario, and will, if possible, have a representative go along and help make the selection. This idea should appeal to farmers' organizations throughout the country. The representative will have to purchase twenty-five rams in order to have his expenses paid by the government.
