### News From Home For Soldiers of Canada at the Front

An Appeal For School Children and School Authorities to Furnish it—The Plan is Interesting

Editor Times:—  
Sir:—The League of the Empire would welcome an opportunity to draw the attention of your readers to the "News from Home" movement.

This movement originated with Mr. W. K. George, of Toronto, who realized the desire of the Canadian soldiers on active service for local news from Canada, and the impossibility of forwarding a sufficient supply of newspapers to meet the requirements of such a large body of men. A plan to meet this

situation was put before a committee of the League of the Empire by Mr. George, who is a member of the council of the league, and by them the scheme was at once enthusiastically endorsed and accepted.

A deputation from the league then waited upon the school board of Toronto and secured their active interest and co-operation. The suggestion that our soldiers would welcome news from home collected and forwarded by the pupils of our schools met with the kindest and warmest approval of the board and the chief inspector. Fifty volumes a week are now going forward from Toronto to all Toronto men in England, thanks to the splendid enthusiasm of the teachers and pupils, and from all parts of Canada, from Prince Edward Island to Alberta, letters are being received by the league endorsing the idea and stating that it will be carried out by various schools. Every district in Canada which has sent men with the contingents is most earnestly requested to look upon this movement as a national work and to take it up on behalf of our soldiers. If the pupils of the high schools and public schools in each city, town and country district represented at the front, will send to their own men "News from Home," they will give an interest and pleasure to hours spent in camp and trench, impossible, perhaps, for the boys and girls themselves to realize.

In detail the plan is as follows: Plain brown manilla wrapping paper should be used for the volume and should contain about ten or twelve sheets. An outside cover is used with the title "News from Home" Clippings from (date) to (date). When the issue is complete the loose papers are strongly sewn together and forwarded to the proper address, in England, of the officer commanding the division in which the men are from the district furnishing the volume. This address will vary, but may always be procured from the military headquarters of the division in which the school is situated. The expense of the manilla paper, which is nominal, might well be borne by the school boards. The paper should be as tough as possible, but if it is not too stiff to roll the postage would also be a small item. Each school which undertakes to produce a weekly or fortnightly volume appoints a committee composed of teachers and scholars, and upon the hearty co-operation of the teachers depends, of course, the success of the work. The work is entirely voluntary patriotic service on the part of the teachers and pupils of the schools and making no encroachment on the field of regular school work as it is done outside school hours and is an offering of service at this time on behalf of our country from teachers and pupils of the national schools.

As to the most welcome items, the following are suggested: All local items, city, town, or district news, social and personal items, birth, marriage and death notices, university and college news, items of Canadian news of special interest, illustrations of local interest, and sports, sports, and yet more sports. The principals and pupils of the Toronto public schools have kindly undertaken to prepare extra copies of the "News from Home" volumes which the committee of the board of education has generously arranged to distribute on application, to other school boards throughout the province, as well as to leading centres in other provinces in Canada. It may be assumed that these

centres in other provinces will, in their turn, undertake a similar service to other school boards. The welcome these budgets will get from the men is already assured by the letters that have been received from some of those at Salisbury Plain who have seen the plan alluded to in the papers and who write that they are looking eagerly for the arrival of the clippings and that they are furnished for home news.

It is earnestly hoped that the school inspectors and school principals in all districts represented at the front will adopt this movement as a national one and will now proceed to carry it out with such modifications and changes as in their eyes may seem best adapted to local conditions, considering always the two essentials, that the men specially long for local and sports news, and that all clippings must be supervised by someone in authority.

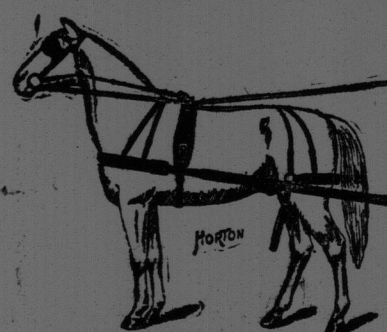
