FEARFUL SCENE IN ALBERTA HOME; WHOLE FAMILY MURDERED

Ramsay, Alb., July 28—George Robinson, a prosperous farmer of the Ramsey district, was found lying in his own home with the top of his head blown completely off. Across his body was a shotgun. Opposite him on the floor was the body of his wife, shot through the right breast, her face bruised and beaten almost beyond recognition. In the kitchen their twelve-year-old son was found shot to death, while in a bed in the rear bedroom was the body of their three-year-old daughter, her head blown completely off. Furniture was overturned and there was evidence of a fierce fight going on in every room.
