

EACH OF THEM IS ASKING DIVORCE

Former Trainer of German Crown Prince in New York Case.

New York, April 28.—The matrimonial differences between Mrs. Marie G. Goldreich and Armand M. Goldreich, who was physical instructor to the former Crown Prince of Germany, began in Hungary soon after the beginning of the World War, and now are being continued in New York, where Mr. Goldreich is suing for a divorce and his wife has filed a counter claim, also for divorce.

Mr. Goldreich is pursuing his physical culture activities here under the name of Professor A. M. Sullivan, and has a studio at 667 Madison avenue, which was rented originally, according to the affidavit of a private detective, by Mrs. Beatrice W. Flieger, widow of John H. Flieger.

Mr. and Mrs. Goldreich were married in 1899 in Petrograd. They have a son 17 years old. Mr. Goldreich names one Martin Hurlig in his action, to which his wife replies that there is no ground for the allegation of her husband, as Hurlig, who is 16 years her junior, was only one of several boarders she was compelled to keep.

In her counter claim Mrs. Goldreich names Emma Dimpke as a friend of her husband. She also tells something about her life with the physical instructor in Europe. She says that Mr. Goldreich abandoned her in September, 1914, and that she sued him for a divorce in Hungary, but was com-

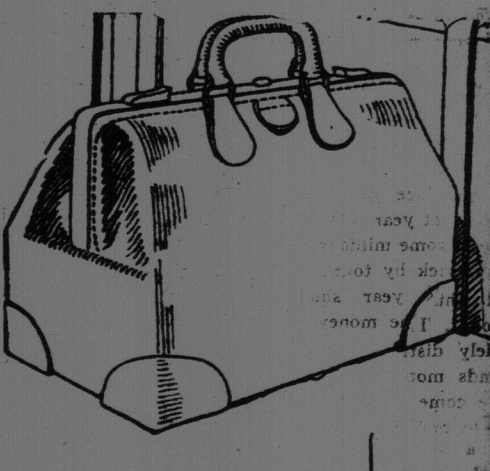
