

MINUTES, &c.

MONDAY, June 27th, 1842.

The Introductory Sermon was preached by the Rev. John Chase from 1st Cor. 5, 12—"But suffer all things, lest we should hinder the gospel of Christ."

A Collection was then taken in aid of Missions, in addition to one taken on the preceding Sabbath.

Rev. J. Pryor was appointed Moderator; Rev. William Chipman, Clerk; and brother I. L. Chipman, Assistant Clerk; Rev. Silas Rand, and brother Samuel Richardson, were appointed to read the Letters from the Churches to the Association; and Rev. Messrs. Geo. Dimock, A. V. Dimock, H. Porter, and C. Randall, to examine the same.

The following Brethren were appointed a Committee to examine into and report on any subjects referred to in the Letters from the Churches for the consideration of the Association, viz:—Rev. Messrs. E. Manning, T. S. Harding, C. Tupper, N. Veditoe, and brethren S. Taylor, and W. Randal.

All ordained Ministers present not named in the Letters from the Churches as Messengers, were invited to take their seats with the Association.

The Letters from the Churches were then read, and the following Minutes taken.
