years past, but owing to the unanimity and willingness of heart shown by the members and adherents, the whole debt has been wiped off.

There has been paid in on stipend account during the year \$882.75, so that the stipend has been paid up in full and there is \$82.75 of a balance on hand. This is the largest amount ever contributed to stipend in one year by the Chatsworth congregation.

Contributions to the schemes of the church are a little in advance of that of last year, being \$93.00, or about \$15.00 more than that of 1898, and we hope now that when there is no more building debt to pay that our contributions to the schemes may be much larger next year.

The total receipts for all purposes during the year amounts to \$2876.00. All of which is respectfully submitted in the name of the Managers.

Report of Women's Foreign Mission Society.

This is an increase of \$20 over last year. Apart from this we feel much good is being done which cannot be estimated by material things.

We are indebted to many "Scattered Helpers" for the aid given both in offerings and preparing the bale of clothing for the Indian Schools in the North West.

Although the membership of 15 is small in comparison with what the society would wish to have, yet we hope the time may soon come when every woman in our church shall deem it a privilege to become a member of the W.F. M.S.
