15. ELOCUTION.

Instruction is given in this subject at hours that will be settled at the beginning of the session. Special fee for session, \$2.

16. GYMNASTICS.

Instructor :- R. T. MACKENZIE, B.A.

The classes will meet at the University Gymnasium, at hours to be announced at the commencement of the Session. The Wicksteed silver and bronze medals (the gift of Dr. R. J. Wicksteed) are offered for competition to Students of the Graduating Class and to Students who have had instruction in the Gymnasium for two sessions,—the silver medal to the former, the bronze medal to the latter.
