

MINUTES
OF THE
TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL CONVENTION

ONTARIO TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION

*Held in the Public Hall of the Education Department, Toronto, on the
12th, 13th and 14th days of August, 1884.*

TUESDAY, August 12th, 1884.

The Convention met at 11 a.m.

The President, Hon. G. W. Ross, in the chair.

Mr. Robert McQueen read a portion of Scripture and led in prayer.
