General Notes and News.
A Port Arthur despatch says there is information of a terrible accident on 24th on McLeod's contract on Red Sucker Cove, 170 miles east. A powerful blast started a large ledge of rock, which in its fall buried six men. Six bodies had been removed up to that evening. It was also reported that three men were killed on 24th on Ryan & Doherty's contract by the premature explosion of a blast.

She has just been notified that the ticket, one fifth of which she holds, No. 70,468, has drawn the \$75,000 prize.—Philadelphia (Pa.) News, Sept. 26.
Paris is considering the advisability of establishing public gaming houses.
The majority against the Scott Act in Peel, Ont., was 198. Liquor sellers are delighted over the result and have determined now to enter upon all fights vigorously. Too much singing and too little conversing and chattering were the cause of the temperance people's defeat.

Germany is said to be endeavouring
