CALCUTTA, April 13.—Lord Kitchener speaking in the Legislative Council on the Indian budget, said some members had alluded to a possible reduction of the military charges, owing to the recent agreement with and the cordial relations existing between the great northern power and ourselves.

This factor had not been overlooked nor underrated, but other weighty reasons affecting the external and internal securify of India must be kept constantly in view.

Lord Minto expressed hearty agreement with Lord Kitchener's views with regard to military charges, and said that the Commander-in-Chief's scheme had recently enabled India to draw a sharper and better sword than ever before. The result had been a remarkable success from the point of view of brevity and economy.



SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATION; Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatche wan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26 not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 165 acres, more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an agency on certain con-

for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he sc desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or mother).

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowances crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to per-

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing must be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply for patent.
