THE THUNDER DRUM.

The thunder you hear at the theatre or the motion picture house is produced by means of the "thunder drum" which is also used to make that rumbling so necessary for war scenes. It consists of a substantial wooden frame about fifty-six inches square and seven inches deep, with an extra thick and heavy skin stretched across it. This drum is properly suspended behind the scenes, and the head is tightened by the heat from electric lamps or coils of a special skind of wire. Then when the sound of peals of thunder or deep rumblings are required, the drum is repeatedly struck with soft drum sticks which imitates the sounds called, for remarkably well.
