THE SUGAR CROP

San Juan, P.R., Sept. 25.—The government announced that the sugar crop for 1918 is 453,796 short tons, as compared with 503,881 tons in 1917, a decrease of slightly over ten per cent.

The prospect for the 1919 crop indicates that there will be a further reduction in the amount of sugar raised next year.


