

PROHIBITION ENFORCEMENT SEEMS TO BE EITHER WASTEFUL OR COSTLY

Large Sums Are Paid to Sub-Inspectors Under the Head of "Expenses" With the Necessity for, or Accuracy of Which No Enquiry is Made—An Inspectorship An Easy Way for a Lazy Man to Make a Living.

The enforcement of the prohibitory law in this province cost last year \$35,151.19. The greater portion of this amount is swallowed up in the salaries and expenses of the inspectors, though considerable sums were paid out in fees to lawyers for attending to prosecutions. Auto hire seems to figure pretty extensively in the payments; one Orville Richard having expended no less than \$320 on this account. Whether he owned the car

when he had finished paying the hire of it, does not appear. Apparently, a considerable number of convictions have been upset on appeal as some \$1,200 or more had been paid in fines had to be refunded.
