under trial for any offence against the law. but in this respect a poor Indian is no worse of than a poor white man, indeed he is probably not so friendless, as the Judges in this bolony have always made it their opecial care that Indians on trial should be at least at no disadvantage on account of their being Indians.

The Magiotiales too throughout the bolony are the specially constituted protectors of the Indians against injustice. They are in fact Indian agents in all but the name and I am confident that they have so performed this well understood branch of their duty, that as full a measure of protection and general advantage has been be stowed on the Indians through their agency by Government out of the pecuniary means at its disposal for this purpose as could have been afforded to them through the medium of a special Indian Department.

The Indiano have in fact her held to be the special wards of the brown, and in the exercise of this quar dianohih Government has in all cases where it has been considered desirable for the interests of the Indiano. set about such portions of the brown Rando as were deemed proportionale
