Came to St. Catherines, Ont., 1857, and ed. at Public Schools and Grantham Academy, now St. Catherines Coll. Institute. Married at Grosse Isle. Michigan, 17 Oct., 1874, Josephine, eldest dau. of the late Col. T. F. Broadhead. Is an editor and publisher. Established the St. Catherines Daily and Weekly News with Mr. R. Matheson in 1872, and the Amherstburg Echo with Mr. J. A. Auld in 1874, and which he still edits.
