HALF-WAY UP A TREE

A believable performance

If you missed seeing "Half Way Up a Tree", presented by the Mississauga Players at Huron Park Theatre Friday, you missed a very good comedy.

On the whole, it was well done and the play moved with a good tempo which didn't let up and cause anyone to lose interest. Mr. Ustinov has written some very funny lines.

Directing by John Leberg was well done. Actors and actresses delivered a smooth, professional performance which the audience thoroughly enjoyed.

Much of the credit for the excellent performance should also go to stage manager Bruce Leadbetter, who presented the three acts without a flaw.

The theatre itself seemed to be perfectly suited for this type of production.

It was nice to see a familiar face in the group in the person of Roger Monk, whom I had seen just a few months before at the Richmond Hill Little Theatre in the Restoration play, "The Beaux' Stratagem".

In the first act, Jessie Booker, who played Lady Fitzbutress, and Alan Whitely, who played the general, really walked away with the performance, the dialogue was witty and their timing perfect. Alan was every inch the general of the Imperial era.

Beverly Young, as Helga, was the beautiful promiscuous Scandinavian maid, physically attractive and very convincing in the final act, although at times she seemed to be reading her lines.

Roger Monk, playing the general's hippie son, was excellently costumed, was a little weak in the opening act in dialogue, but pulled it off well in the second and third.

Jean Lewis, who played his girl friend, Leslie, didn't have much to say, but her costume was good and she was believable.

Ann Coutts, who played Robert's pregnant sister, did not strike me as one of the "free" swinging generation, but more of the suburban "girl-next-door" type, a nice girl trying to be a swinger. But as her part enlarged in the second act, it was better, and in the third, she projected stronger as the sex symbol, but who, underneath the modern facade, wants to become a respectable married woman.

One of the high points was the entrance of Tiny Gilliatt-Brown, played by G. His timing was off at times and funny lines were lost in too-rapid delivery. Basil Utterwood, played by Frank Beddall as the bumbling innocent who loves scouting, hiking, etc. As straight-man, he delivered his lines well and drew laughs.

Finally, the Vicar, played by John Wood, was very convincing and well played.

Basil came upon the scene rather abruptly, leaving the audience mystified as to who he was, what he represented and why.

In "Half Way Up", Peter Ustinov has a comedy with a message: "what does the hip generation want?"

He manages to inject considerable humor into the question of whether the hippies actually have courage in their convictions, or are simply trying to be different.

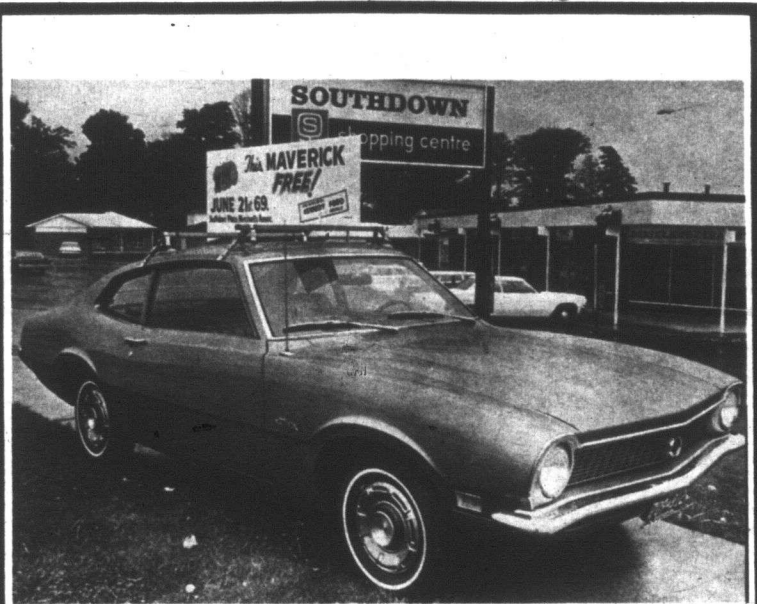
With the emphasis on quality, the Hanneford Circus is fun for children of all ages. To avoid standing in line on show day, tickets should be purchased in advance.
