
Sir,-

In reply to your letter of the 17th ultimo I beg to inform you that three 9 foot Union Jacks will be sent you, one for each of the three Indian schools in your Superintendency, viz., Burnt Church, Big Cove and Eel Ground. You are hereby authorized to have suitable flagstaff erected at each of these schools at a cost not to exceed \$10.00 or \$30.00 in all. Each flagstaff should be securely guyed and be fully equipped with necessary pulley, halyard, etc.

This work should be undertaken as soon as possible and when completed you will then deliver a flag to each teacher, or other competent person, who is to be responsible for the charge of same and for the raising and lowering on all occasions.

Separate vouchers should be submitted for this work, in the case of each school.
