Referring to your note of the 2nd instant
for the Indians' consent to establish, for my benefit,
Sir,-

the irrigation ditch known as Deadman Creek Irrigation Reserve I am
very anxious to have it done. Referring to your letter of the 5th
instant and enclosures I am directed to instruct you to
convey to the Sno-hosh Water, Light and Power Company
the permission of the Superintendent General of Indian
Affairs to occupy, during pleasure, the strip of land
in the Deadman's Creek Indian Reserve, B.C., required for
the irrigation ditch of the said Company, and subject
to the conditions mentioned in the consent dated 21st
May, 1908 given by the Indians of the Band.

The first clause in the consent states
that the right to 500 inches of water from Deadman's
Creek is reserved to the Indians. If they are to
have the right to take the said 500 inches of water from
the Company's ditch, the fact should be clearly stated.

The blue print forwarded with the
application shows approximately the location of the
ditch through the Reserve. The Company should file
in this Department a plan showing the correct location
and the land occupied.
