

K NOW all Men by these Presents, That I *Sejourné*
 Merchant, am held and firmly bound, unto our Sovereign Lord *Montreal*
 the KING, in the full Sum of *three hundred*
Pounds current Money of this Province, to be
 made and levied of my Goods and Chattels, Lands and Tenements
 respectively, to the Use of our said Sovereign Lord the King, his
 Heirs and Successors, to the true Payment whereof, I bind myself,
 my Heirs, Executors and Administrators, firmly by these Presents,
 witness my Hand and Seal, this *Eleventh* Day
 of *May* One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy
 and in the *Tenth* Year of the Reign of His
 Majesty King GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of God, of
Great-Britain, France and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith,
 and so forth.

THE CONDITION of this Obligation is such, That whereas the
 above-bounded *Sejourné*
Day of May has obtained a Licence, dated *Eleventh*
 under His Majesty's Protection, at *Michilimachinac* and from
 thence to any Markets or Parts which he shall find most advantageous
 for the Sale of his Merchandize, for the Space of *Twelve* Months
 from the Date thereof. Now if the said *Sejourné*
 shall well and truly, in all Things, conform to and
 perform the several Conditions recited in the Licence before-mentioned,
 and shall also well and truly keep and observe the Matters and Things
 enjoyned in the several Oaths endorsed upon the said Licence, a Du-
 plicate of which is hereunto annexed, then this Obligation to be void,
 or else to remain in full Force and Virtue.
