

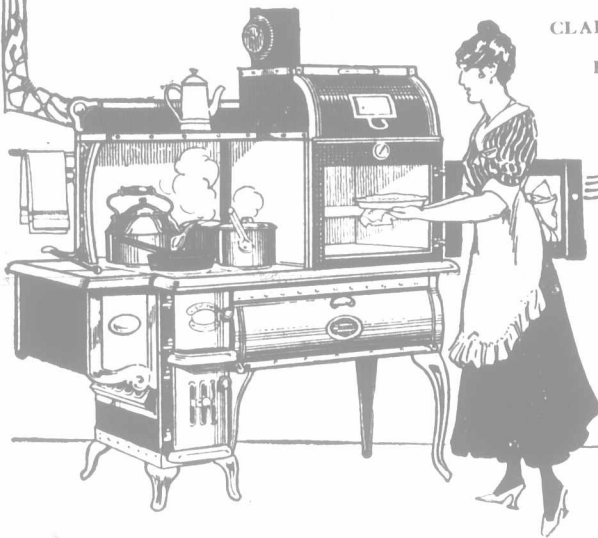
LIGHTER DAY
