And the first of the said resolutions being again read;

Mr. Mure moved, feconded by Mr. M'Cord; that the faid resolution be amended as follows: after "that" in the second line, insert, "it is not necessary or advisable to declare that,"

The House divided on the question:

Yeas 8 Nays 22

So it passed in the negative.

The question was now put upon the first resolution of the Committee;

The House divided, and the names being called for, they were taken down as follows:
