PRAYERS.

Ordered, That the Bill intituled "An Act to authorize the appointment of Hog Reeves in certain Districts in this Island, and to prevent the going at large of Swine within the same," be now read for the second time.

The said Bill was, according to order, read a second time.

On motion, the House was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee on the said Bill.

After some time, the House was resumed; and

Mr. Simpson reported from the said Committee, that they had gone through the Bill, and had directed him to report the same with an amendment, which he was ready to submit whenever the House would be pleased to receive it.

Ordered, That the Report be now received; and

The said amendment was then read by the Clerk, as follows:

Folio 2, line 15, -Strike out "three days," and insert "forty-eight hours."

The said amendment being read a second time, and the question of concurrence put thereon, it was agreed to.
