### SHAW AT HOCKEY GAME

IRISH PLAYWRIGHT WAS DIS APPOINTED, HE SAYS.

He Had Expected To See Seven Young Men Perform Wonders In Co-operation, But There Were Seven Other Young Men to Thwart Them-Degenerated Into Something Like Politics Before Long.

The Irish playwright, Socialist and critic, George Bernard Shaw, is like a religious revival. He wanders into strange places. It is not always the elect that are called upon. But the fact remains that Mr. Shaw has deigned to record his impressions of the most characteristic of Canadian pastimes. If there is in his account very much Shaw and very little hockey, those who know him best can assure us that he is making a very generous and unusual concession in not givin is all Shaw. 
