

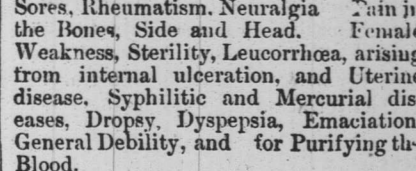

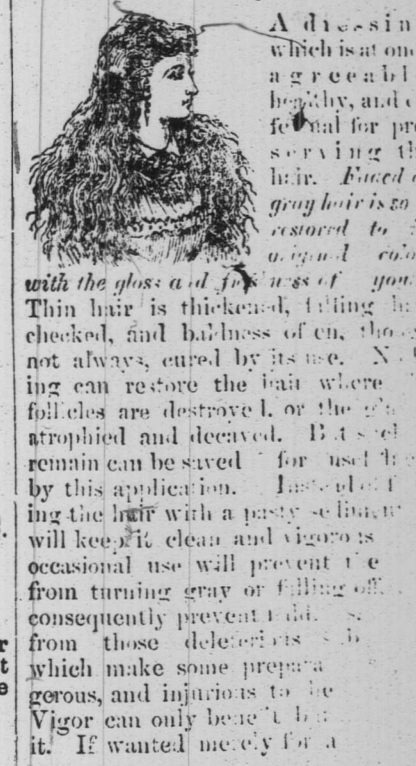

"A despatch from Montevideo, dated October 12th, says Chili, as a condition of peace, demands of Bolivia the cession of the whole of the territory of Atacama, and from Peru the cession of the town of Tarapaca."

Through their whole history, the Orange Order, although largely composed of tenants, has been the complainant tool of the landlord party.
