In S. S. No. 6 North Grimsby new brick building was erected and was ready for occupation at the New Year. This School is an up to date buildings with cloak rooms, teachers room, basement, hot air furnace, and lavatories complete.

In S. S. No. 3 Louth a new two room, brick building was erected which is very complete. This is probably as fine a two roomed school as there is in the Province.

In several other sections, increased accommodation is urgently needed, but the high prices now prevailing and the unsettled labor situation, and the difficulty of procuring materials as to the advisability of undertaking building operations at the present time. There are many advantages in conolidation, especailly where the schools are small. A large central school, would have several teachers. and the classes would be graded properly. All the subjects could be better taught, and provision could be made for Domestic Science, Manual Training, and Agriculture. The pupils plete in every way. Especially would this be the case if a Community Hall were added to the School. There would then be a community centre in each district with great advantage pupils, teachers, and the whole community. There are several districts in this county where consolilation would be a great improvement and I hope to arrange with the Department to hold meetings wherever and whenever the public are enough nterested to consider the matter. School Attendance. The new School Attendance Act came into force in 1920. The aim is to improve the attendance in our schools especially in the rural schools-The average attendance at the majority of the schools is fairly satisfactory, but there are some sections where an improvement should be made. The average daily attendance for the whole county is 2951.1 and the g the year is 4949. The average attendance is about 60 per cent. of he total enrollment. This is scarcely fair estimate as the total enrollment includes pupils who were enrolled for part of the year only. In visiting the schools, I found the uroan schools had an average attendtotal enrollment. On the other hand some of the rural sections had an average attendance of 57 per cent of the enrollment at the time. This means that 43 per cent. of the pupils were absent all the time, or that all the pupils were absent 43 per cent. of the time.
