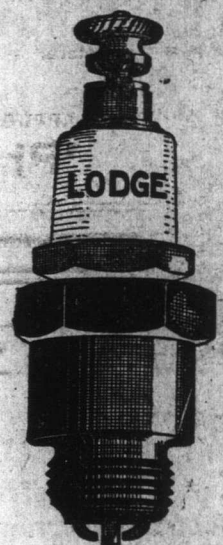

**Poll Tax Warning.**

**DELINQUENTS WILL BE FINED.**  
Those who have not yet paid their poll tax had better give the matter their attention at once. In future, any delinquents who come before the magistrate will not only have to pay their tax, but also a fine of five dollars or in default, 10 days imprisonment. This dictum was handed down by Judge Morris in the Central District Court to-day when Mr. E. Leo Carter, Council Solicitor, prosecuted 20 young men who had not paid up. In future, Mr. Carter says, he would prosecute with the utmost rigour of the law.

**Is There Another Loan?**

One of the passengers by the S.S. Digby from Halifax is Mr. W. B. Milner, who represents the Dominion Securities Corporation. It will be remembered that the Corporation negotiated the last six million dollar loan to the Government. The question is being asked in there another loan being negotiated in connection with the Railroad?

**The Railway and the Alternative.**

There were no new developments in the railway situation to-day and the question of settlement now rests with the Government. If they purpose to buy the railway another loan will be made necessary, and the arrival in the city of a representative of the Dominion Securities Co. lends color to that impression. The Government's other alternative is arbitration, and this may mean a greater loss than would be made by direct purchase.

**WHERE WILL IT END?**  
BELFAST, May 20. Reports of the number of deaths in yesterday's shooting throughout Belfast vary from five to eight, while a dozen or more persons were wounded. Three men who were shot upon avowing themselves Protestants, died during the night. Murder gangs were active early this morning. Two men entered saw mills in York street inquiring the religion of the various workers, and shot dead a Catholic, John Connolly. Sinn Fein forces are reported to have captured police barracks at Glenties, Martindale, Carnlough and Cumbullall in County Antrim.

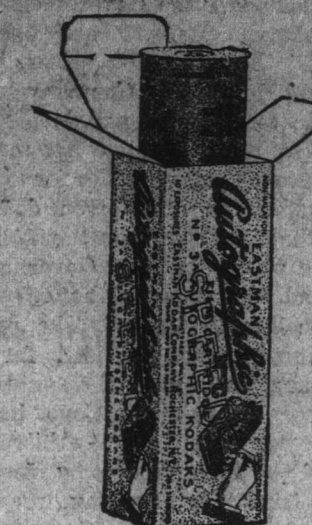
