### Yesterday's Late Cables

#### BRIGHTER OUTLOOK IN INDUSTRIAL TRIANGLE.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9. For the first time in many months, current economic reports to the Commerce Department indicate a betterment of business conditions in Great Britain, a decrease of unemployment, rise in price of industrial stocks and the general attitude of buyers towards closing transactions as cited as factors indicating that conclusion.

#### COLD WAVE COMING EAST.

NEW YORK, Nov. 9. A wave of freezing weather that was accompanied by blizzards in the Middle West and indirectly caused three deaths, reached here to-day, but is expected to have passed eastward by to-morrow.

#### ARMISTICE DAY OBSERVED IN LONDON CHURCHES.

LONDON, Nov. 9. In connection with Armistice Day there was general observance of the anniversary in the churches yesterday. The churches were crowded at all services.

#### ARMED RAIDS IN DUBLIN.

DUBLIN, Nov. 9. Three raids by armed men were carried out in Dublin to-day, these being attributed to a recrudescence of Republican activities brought on by the preparations to celebrate Armistice Day. Civil guards are scouring Dublin and suburbs but so far no arrests have been made.

#### WILL NOT RUN IN BAGOT.

OTTAWA, Nov. 9. None of the defeated Cabinet Ministers will run in Bagot, it was intimated to-day. This means that neither Premier King nor Hon. G. P. Graham, who, of the defeated Ministers, alone remain in the Cabinet, will have a seat when Parliament opens. Hon. Ernest Lapointe, Minister of Justice, is mentioned as the temporary Premier when the House opens on December 10th.

#### SCOTCH WHISKEY OUTPUT DOWN 25 PER CENT.

NEW YORK, Nov. 9. Scottish distillers will cut the production of 1926 twenty-five per cent, because of decrease in the United States trade through rum running channels, George Watson, a large grain importer, announced to-day.

#### SUGGESTS CONFERENCE ON THE COAL STRIKE.

HARRISBURGH, Pa., Nov. 9. Governor Finch to-day sent letters to W. W. Inglis, chairman of the anthracite operators negotiating committee and John L. Lewis, International President of the United Mine Workers, asking them to meet him to discuss the coal strike situation.

#### ANGLO-AMERICAN UNDERSTANDING A GUARANTEE OF PEACE.

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Nov. 9. The greatest guarantee of world peace is an understanding between Great Britain and the United States, the British Ambassador, Sir Esmé Howard, told a meeting to-night of the English-speaking Union at St. Louis.

#### R.C. CHURCH DESTROYED BY FIRE

BATHURST, N.E., Nov. 9. The beautiful Catholic Church at Tracadie, near here, was totally destroyed by fire last night. The building, valued at \$200,000, was partly insured. The origin of the fire is unknown.

ing. Ultra-violet produces a fermentation in the body which reduces hardness of tissue and also builds up blood tissues. A particular shade of violet causes the growth of bone; an indigo produces hydrocarbonates and body tissues; a shade of blue produces muscular generation and strength; a shade of green increases the vitality and general energy of the system and also the growth of fat; yellow restores the nerves. But, of course, the greatest care must be taken that only the right shade of each color is used or opposite results may be obtained.

"The treatment would also benefit most people suffering from premature old age and mental worry produced by past illnesses. I do not claim that it can make people of 60 feel like 35, but it certainly can restore them to the state of activity and fitness they enjoyed a dozen years before.

"I hope that the new method will eventually lead to a cure for consumption."

### Poultry Ass'n Meeting

The Monthly meeting of the Newfoundland Poultry Association was held in the Board of Trade Rooms last night. A large attendance was present and all final arrangements were made for the annual show. The services of Judge Warrington, an Ontario certified judge, have been obtained to place the awards on the poultry. He will come to St. John's, after judging the Halifax poultry show. Messrs. D. Percy, James Ewing, and W. H. Cave have consented to judge the foxes and Messrs. H. W. LeMessurier, Dr. Furneaux and W. H. Cave the Newfoundland dogs. The lottery committee reported good sales of tickets. Special arrangements are being made to interest and induce outport breeders to send in entries of poultry. Everything points to the show being up to the usual standard. Members report good sales of eggs at \$1.00 a dozen, and dressed poultry at 60c per lb, with the demand greater than the supply.

### How to Prevent Organic Diseases

The business executive in these days is hearing much about prevention—prevention of accidents, prevention of unemployment, prevention of ill health due to unsanitary industrial conditions. The emphasis upon prevention is peculiarly American.

So far as the ill of the economic body are concerned, the American business man is increasingly accepting the principle of prevention as better than cure. It is not only more humane but less costly in the end. The same idea lies behind the prevention of organic disease.

These organic troubles are the ones most frequently found in the physical examination of business men: Traces of albumin in the urine, high blood pressure, sometimes low blood pressure, and slight thickening of the arteries are signals that suggest the importance of taking preventive measures.

In answer to the question, "How shall I live in order to avoid these organic maladies?" we may say: Temperance all along the line—in eating, drinking, working, playing, and even in resting. It is possible to "rust out" on the one hand or "wear out" on the other.

Overeating, especially of meat and of rich, highly-seasoned foods, overweight, too little exercise, too much, prolonged, or exhausting athletic excess, abuse of alcohol and tobacco, excess of tea and coffee, worry and fear states—these are some of the factors which contribute to the development of chronic organic disease.—Eugene Lyman Fisk, M.D., in Forbes Magazine (N.Y.)

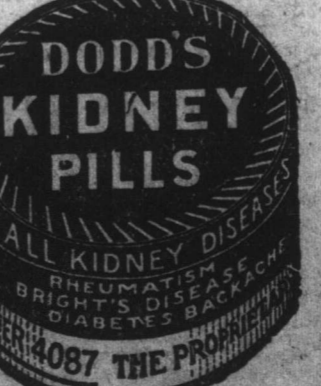
