Charles Tupper, late Prime Minister of Nova Scotia, and Mr. Sanford Fleming, Engineer to the Intercolonial Railway These gentlemen are now staying at Valentia, the guests of the Knight of Kerry, whose co-operation they have secured, as his territory is to be the starting point of the new route. Be tween the port of Valentia-which is to be linked in civilization by an extension of the railway from Killarney -and St. John's Newfoundland, swift sailing steamers, capable of travelling at the rate of sixteen nautical miles an hour, are to run, by which means the Atlantic voyage will be reduced to 100 hours. From St. John's the passengers are to be conveyed by rail and steamboats to the eastern terminus of the Grand Trunk Railway, from which point they can proceed to any part of the Transatlantic continent By this route a traveller would arrive in New York from London in seven days.
