RUSSIA'S DEFECTION

The Allied nations must realize by now that the Bolsheviks are determined to make a separate peace with Germany. All indications are that the threatened break-off in negotiations was a bluff, either to delude the Russian people or else to make it appear to the Allies that the Lemnites are sincere in their declaration for peace with no annexations or indemnities. Probably the negotiations will be greatly prolonged, but even now the two nations are on the most friendly relations. Germany has already commenced her campaign of peaceful penetration. The bulk of the Russian people do not wish for a German peace, but through disorganization, social disruption, industrial chaos, and military ineptitude, they have no other choice unless they wish to continue to fight when they know they are hopelessly beaten. Only a long period of reorganization can restore Russia's strength. The internal problems are so intricate that they cannot be solved with an enemy at the gates. In the hour of her weakness the world will extend its sympathy to the Russian people, but at the same time the Allies will have to take steps to offset German influence in the country.

More than ever now—and it always was the main pre-occupation of the war—the Allies must realize that victory can only be won in the West. The Russian defection has increased the military burden and at the same time put a new diplomatic one on the shoulders of the Allies, for they will have to exert every effort in their power to make the Russians understand that their aims are identical as far as the freedom of nations is concerned. A disconcerting feature of Russia's separate peace will be the release of so many German and Austrian prisoners, reputed in some estimates to reach 1,500,000. Of these possibly 500,000 are fit for service again, and to that extent the armies of the Central Powers will be reinforced. Obviously one of the first developments following peace between Russia and the Central Powers

would be an enemy offensive in Macedonia. That is the danger of the coming months. The reports that Germany is preparing a great offensive in the West are probably untrue, although they come from the best informed quarters. The enemy by now realizes that while he may gain temporary advantages in the West, he cannot win the decision there. This realization explains his different peace offensives. The danger point during the present year will be Macedonia and an attempted enemy sweep to obtain command of a large portion of the Mediterranean littoral. In this way he can strike at Britain, France and Italy. Doubtless measures will be taken to maintain such a pressure in the West that any plans Germany may formulate for victory elsewhere will be checkmated.

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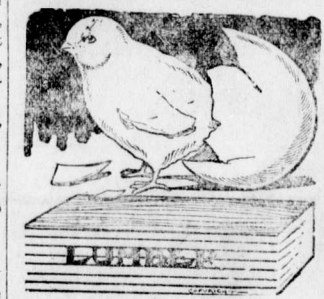
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
