How About Your Milk?

Medical Health Officer Hutchinson's Semi-Annual Report.

First Meeting of the New Board of Health.

Dr. C. L. T. Campbell Re-elected Chairman.

More Strict Regulations Regarding the Reporting of Infectious Diseases Necessary.

The new Board of Health held its inaugural meeting last night, elected a chairman, and received the medical health officer's report of the past year.

Those present were: Dr. Campbell (chairman), Mayor Little, ex-Ald. Skinner, John Christie, ex-Ald. John Heaman, D. W. Blackwell, Jas. H. Bowman, Medical Health Officer Hutchinson and James Lutton, assistant health inspector.

After reading the minutes of the last regular meeting the new members were installed in their seats. James H. Bowman, whose term of office expired, has been re-elected, and Daniel W. Blackwell to succeed Mr. Geo. White.

Wm. Skinner and John Christie moved to re-elect Dr. C. L. Campbell as chairman, and this was unanimously carried. Dr. Campbell, in a few apt remarks, thanked them for the honor conferred upon him, and drew attention to the important duties, responsibilities and powers of the board.

The doctor reiterated the statement he had made some time ago in regard to London being probably the most healthy city in America. He said although the Board of Health was separate from the council, everything would be conducted on the most economical basis, and he thought the composition of the board was a sufficient guarantee of that. London had

good sanitary regulations, an excellent supply of pure water, and a fair system of milk inspection. One thing might be improved. They might send inspectors to get to the back yards were clean, but if the citizens remembered the fact that "cleanliness was next to godliness," they would keep their yards clean and save the city considerable expense. Other matters of importance were the reporting of infectious diseases, and the enactment of sanitary plumbing bylaws.

THE MILK INSPECTION. The health officer's report of the milk inspection was then read and in substance was as follows: "To the Chairman, and Board of Health: 'Gentlemen—I have the honor to lay before you the semi-annual report of the inspection of herds and dairies supplying the city with milk. For the inspection of the past year I might be stated that the herds and milk have been classified in accordance with the regulations recently adopted by your board. That by inspection, however, those cases in which from any cause licenses should be withheld or the dealer prosecuted, I have been able to detect and in good condition, with proper food and pure water, and the entire equipment without fault.

In classes B and C there to be entered those cases of a lesser degree of perfection. Class 1 shall embrace all samples of milk containing 4.00 per cent or more of butter fat.

Class 2 from 3.50 to 4.00, and class 3 from 3.00 to 3.50. It will be observed that three samples were found adulterated by the addition of water. In class B, however, added, the object of the latter being to increase the percentage of butter fat, for publication, one vendor's milk going as high as 14.00 per cent.

There are 170 persons engaged in supplying the city with milk. At the present time there are 2500 quarts of milk sold in the city daily. The average percentage of the whole, exclusive of that to which cream had been added, was 3.84.

Ninety-four herds were inspected, of this number 7 were in class A, 73 were in class B and 14 in class C. Several of the herds in the latter class were in such a condition as to almost justify the cancelling of the vendors' licenses. In the case of one, however, given the benefit of the doubt, but should there not be a very marked improvement, the next time the inspection takes place I would recommend the withdrawal of their license.

The present way of delivering milk in the city is, with a few exceptions, both unsatisfactory and unclean. So long as the milk is delivered in tight bottles, the vendor should be compelled to carry his cans in a clean, covered wagon, allowing nothing but the milk to be seen.
