THE QUEEN DELAYED

Trip to Copenhagen Postponed on Account of Gale.

The Irish Parliamentary Party Has Run Short of Money.

Italy Fitting Out a Military Expedition—Belgians Want a Railway Concession in China That Was Granted Long Ago to Britain.

London, March 25.—Very heavy seas are running in the English Channel and the Irish Sea. A number of vessels are in distress.

Queen Alexandra's intended departure this morning for Copenhagen was postponed in consequence of the gale.

SANTOS-DUMONT IN LONDON.

Santos-Dumont arrived in London, bringing the news with which he intends to make a voyage over London, during the coronation festivities. He said he proposed to call for the United States, to which country he goes on his own tour, early in April, and will visit with the authorities at St. Louis on the subject of the conditions of the exposition competitions.

RHODES HAS NOT YET

Cecil Rhodes has not yet left his last night, but the real improvement in his condition is not yet apparent.

SHORT OPINIONS.

The Dublin National press, says a telegram from Dublin to the London Times, is issuing a call for funds for the Irish parliamentary party. In details are given of carrying out the plan of raising money by means of branches of the United Irish League. It seems financial difficulties are threatening the party. The fact is, the party is in a very tight financial straits, and the rich and middle class districts refuse to put their hands in their pockets.

AN AERIAL EXPEDITION.

According to news from Stockholm, experiments have been made at Marinha with the aerial torpedo invention of a Swedish commander of artillery named Unga. The results are said to have been extremely satisfactory. The machine is kept secret, but it is said the machine is not only an engine of destruction, but can be used for saving the lives of shipwrecked persons.

ITALY'S MILITARY EXPEDITION.

A military expedition is being fitted out by the Italian government for the purpose of attacking Tripoli. Two large transports have been chartered, each capable of carrying thousands of soldiers, and the war department is unusually active. A large amount of ammunition is stored in the arsenals, and no leaves of absence are being granted in the army.

BELGIANS WANT UNIVERSAL SUFFRAGE.

The Belgian Liberals and the Socialists, including many members of the Chamber of Deputies, held a big parade at Brussels on Sunday afternoon, and sent a deputation to the Burgomaster bearing a petition for universal suffrage. The Burgomaster promised to submit this petition to parliament.

As Prince Albert (a nephew of King Leopold) was leaving the theater great about twenty students, in the crowd, attributed to the prince and shouted for universal suffrage.
