TO BIG TREASUREThe Newest Yarn From the
Island of Coos.

SHIP CARPENTER'S TALE

The Secret Now in Possession of
Hackett, Who is Looking for a
Hydraulic Plant.

Victoria, Aug. 17.—Capt. Fred Hackett says he is the only living man who knows the exact history of the Coos Island treasure, and the exact spot where it is buried. He is a whaling captain and he says he has visited the very spot.

"I have stood over millions," he exclaims, "and only lack of equipment prevented me from getting the huge hoard from its hiding place of more than 70 years."

The early history of the treasure is well known. In 1835 the British barkentine Mary Dier anchored one night under a Peruvian fort near Callao; the anxious garrison, afraid of their Chilean besiegers, placed the great treasure under the protection of the British flag. The crew, one of whom was a man named Thompson, proved false to their trust, and fleeing through the night, buried the Peruvian millions, gold and jewels, in the lonely island of Coos.

Returning thence they were dismayed by a cyclone and captured by the Peruvians. Nine of the eleven men on board were hanged at the yard-arm. Thompson and a Frenchman were spared to guide their captors to the treasure. But putting into Panama, the fever came on board, and the two prisoners escaped from their harassed guards. They slid down the vessel's side and swam for a whaler which was leaving the harbor. Sharks made a fatal one for the Frenchman, but Thompson, who was the secret of the buried millions.

From this point Capt. Hackett throws fresh light on the old tale. He has the treasure from the lips of a seafarer now dead, who now steps on to the stage.

"I'm telling you something I heard him tell," says Capt. Hackett, "and Keating is the only man but one who ever saw the treasure again." As he saw the treasure again, he tells his story simply and with conviction.

A Hunted Man.

Thompson next shows up at Kingston, Jamaica, a hunted man. He boards a Newfoundland vessel loading with sugar or molasses in search of a job. Keating was carpenter and owner's spotter on the ship at the time. "Thompson was a hard-looking fellow," Keating used to say. He was ragged and worn and it was only on Keating's intercession that the captain took him on. During the voyage the grateful Thompson told Keating the secret of the treasure and gave him the chart he had made of the place. When the ship arrived at St. John's, Nfld., Keating once more befriended Thompson, who was harassed by constant fear of the Peruvian secret service. He smuggled the panic-stricken man on board a vessel bound for London with coal oil and fish.

The story breaks here till 1842 or 1843, when Keating, hitherto half-specter, received a letter from Thompson. Thompson had been in London, and finished by his nurse, for he was dead, stating that the treasure tale was perfectly true.

This letter woke up Keating. In 1844 he got a young fellow named Johnson to fit out a yacht under the command of Capt. Boggart to go in search of the treasure. So he and Boggart cleared for the North Pacific in the Witch Queen ostensibly on a pearl-lure expedition to Dulce Bay. The yacht called at Coos Island for "water," as they said. Keating easily located the treasure and secretly in canvas pockets sewed inside their clothes they carried what they could to the ship.

It was on the way to the ship that the treasure was discovered. The pirates were forced to desert. They sailed for Panama, where they decided to leave the ship. As they went ashore Keating said a black squall overturned the whole boat, and Boggart, his big sea boots laden with gold, was drowned.

Keating crossed the isthmus with mules and guides and got home safely. In 1846 he again set out, this time in the brig Gauntlet. Again he was successful, getting in the two visits to the island.

"His wife," said Hackett, "used to tell me how he returned and threw the treasure on the bed, gold pieces and jewels tumbling together. He started to go to the bank, but when he came back he found the treasure had been taken. He was so angry that he built a 'keating block' and started a 'fishing room' at St. John's. The Gauntlet, which he had left at Panama, was lost with all hands rounding the Horn.

It was in 1878 that Capt. Fred Hackett, eldest brother, first persuaded the silent, shy-eyed Keating to tell his tale. After that beginning he used to describe to the two brothers how scared he had been of going down the first time to the island. After great hardships in the damp tropical climate of this little island he returned empty-handed. His second trip in 1901 was doomed to failure from the start. He sailed against his will without the equipment he had demanded.

Others have tried, too, and failed. Lord Fitzwilliam, Admiral Palliser, and Roland have been there and returned. Roland alone had any information from Keating, and he alone succeeded in getting anywhere near the treasure.

"The seventh wave goes furthest up the beach," the third attempt succeeded, says Capt. Hackett, and he means to start again as soon as he can raise the money. This time he will sail with a private place or not the all. Fantastic as it all sounds, conviction is rooted in this seaman's heart. He has been there, he has found the bearings.

A WARM MANIFESTO

Catholic Carlists of Catalonia Plan
Demonstrations.

Barcelona, Aug. 17.—The Catholic Carlists of Catalonia are engaged in active preparations for a series of open air demonstrations throughout Catalonia, Aug. 28. The proclamations issued by them summon the faithful to come to the defence of "Holy Religion and the Mother Church of St. Peter and the 'Accursed Government,' and abjure the people to come armed and ready to sacrifice their lives for the Pope, who has sent his blessing from Rome. The proclamations terminate in the declaration that the Carlists are the only true and legitimate government of the province, and that they will not throw this impious government."

KOREA'S FINISH

Japan Completing Negotiations for
Annexation of Hermit Kingdom.

Tokio, Aug. 17.—The long awaited annexation of Korea by Japan is about to become a reality, according to special dispatches from Seoul today. The dispatches announced that the final negotiations for the annexation were commenced yesterday by Lieut.-Gen. Viscount Terauchi, the Japanese resident-general in Korea. The resident-general outlined the conditions upon which Japan will sign the agreement for annexation.

It is believed that the negotiations with the members of the Korean cabinet will be concluded in two or three days, and that an early conclusion of the act of annexation may be expected.

PASTOR SHOVELLED COAL

To Earn Money To Pay Funeral Expenses of Child.

Detroit, Aug. 17.—A pitiful example of the overwork of an underpaid clergyman in Michigan diocese, has just been brought to the attention of the church authorities. Because he was unable to support his family, a pastor of a small church in St. Clair County, two weeks ago, in expectation of being able to earn money to pay the funeral expenses of his 14-year-old son, who died a few days ago, he was forced to shovel coal in order to get sufficient funds to bury his child. When the minister's total assets were \$1.50 in cash.

ROAD WILL OPEN UP
NEW TIMBER AREAForestry Parties Along the Hudson's
Bay Line Will Prepare Maps.

Winnipeg, Aug. 17.—A. Knecht, of the Dominion department of forestry, has returned from a trip of some weeks' duration through the new territory which will be opened up by the Hudson Bay Railroad.

From Warren's Landing down he explored the steamer route to the coast. He found Lady Grey and Lady Evelyn Grey from seeing the Governor-General off on his famous northern trip.

The forestry department has established three parties of four men each in the north country along the new line. One party to operate from the Pas along the proposed line of the Hudson Bay Railway, another to operate along the Nelson River to Split Lake; and the third to work round between Norway House and Oxford House, and from there out towards Hudson Bay.

Their duties are to post notices printed in English and Greek along the main lines of travel in the far north, and to meet travellers and to attract them with regard to the great necessity of putting their camp fires out before leaving them. In case a fire occurs the party having charge of the district is supposed to do their best to extinguish it. Their winter work will be to locate and to prepare a map of all tracts of timber land, giving an estimate of the kinds and quantities. Mr. Knecht said he was surprised to find the country as heavily timbered as it was, although not of large dimensions.

CRAWFORD'S SOFT THING

An Action at Law To Restrain Him
From Taking That Pension.

Toronto, Aug. 17.—An action at law to restrain the city council from paying over a pension from the firemen's benefit fund to ex-Capt. William Crawford is almost a certainty if that body decides to ratify the report of the fire and light committee and give him \$400 per year for the balance of his days. Crawford is claimed by those who know him best, to be physically feeble, and is sufficiently able to fill a position that was created for him by Hon. Dr. Fyfe at \$1,500 a year. Many citizens regard the action of the board of control as a potential pool of robbery for the widows and orphans of firemen. The ground is taken that if any newspaper had accused Capt. Crawford as being unfit for duty previous to his accepting a government job, it would have been sued for libel. The firemen pay little into the fund from which Crawford hopes to draw his pension. It is largely kept up by the civic grants to the fire department, and the board provide for the widows and orphans of firemen, or for firemen who become physically incapacitated through duty. Crawford's salary was about \$1,200 a year as captain of a brigade, and his pension was fixed on the basis of half the salary he received while in the city's service. Crawford is a prominent Orangeman, and for years was a ward politician.

METHODIST MISSIONS
INCOME ON INCREASEWork of the Women's Society
Shows Great Progress.

Victoria, B. C., Aug. 17.—At the Methodist Conference it was shown that the income of the Methodist Society has steadily increased during the past quadrennium, as will be seen in the following figures:

Receipts for 1906-07 \$444,677
Receipts for 1907-08 \$487,121
Receipts for 1908-09 \$538,145
Receipts for 1909-10 \$581,121

The figures show that several of the central conferences have made very satisfactory progress in leading their missions to self-support. The Young People's Forward Movement has been quite active during the past four years, and the receipts from Epworth Leagues and Sunday schools show a most gratifying increase. The campaign of missionary education has been carried on by means of summer schools, missionary literature, etc. At the present time about seventy missionaries are supported by the Epworth Leagues and Sunday schools of the church.

The work of the Women's Missionary Society continues to grow. The outstanding feature of its operations during the past four years are the erection of ten buildings as homes for missionaries, the sending forth of eight new workers to Japan, and twelve to China, the addition of church of 23, through baptism of workers. The staff consists at present of 49 faithful and capable young women in the work of the society. The Women's Missionary Society is very nearly 50,000, an increase during the quadrennium of 10,601. The receipts of the past four years amount to \$397,660. The society owns property to the value of \$160,594, an increase of \$65,000.

The Laymen's Missionary Movement has developed quite rapidly in the denomination during the past four years. No figures, however, can be given, as it is not an organization for the purpose of collecting money or sending missionaries to the foreign field. It is simply an educational and inspirational movement among the men of the churches, and operates through the existing denominational agencies.

The Deaconesses.

There are eighty deaconesses in the Methodist Church in Canada, of whom 43 are licensed, and 37 are probationers. The principal lines of work are visiting, teaching, various classes, leading meetings, nursing the sick in the hospitals, securing work for the unemployed, bringing relief to the needy and suffering—indeed, the scope of the work is limited only by the strength and ability of the worker.

A large number of organizations for young women have come into being in several of the large city churches under the direction of the deaconesses. These associations are composed of young women who are living in boarding houses. They meet weekly in the church, have tea served, the evening is spent in various ways of a social, literary, or religious character. In several of these societies physical culture classes are being conducted. An unusually successful season has been experienced in the fresh air work. A large number of children and mothers have been taken from the city streets into the country during July and August.

The deaconess work has been developed more thoroughly in the Toronto Conference than in any other, but some attention is being given to it in all the conferences at present.

The young man and Miss Cheek had been engaged for some time, but the girl's parents bitterly opposed the match. Early last night Miss Cheek's parents learned that the lovers planned to elope, and they locked the girl in her room after taking away all her clothing.

Buchanan heard of his sweetheart's predicament, and after midnight went in an automobile to the Cheek home. By throwing pebbles against the window he attracted the girl's attention, and found her willing to elope, though she admitted her society rouseau.
