Lemberg Is Threatened by Russians



In Galicia, north of the Carpathians, the Russians have passed the Sereth River, crossed the Strypa, which runs south into the Dniester west of the Sereth and have reached the Zlota Lipa River west of the Strypa.

RUSSIANS HAVE GONE OVER 60 MILES INTO AUSTRIAN COUNTRY

Petrograd, via London, June 9.—8:30 p.m.—Five days of furious offensive by the forces of Gen. Brusilov has crumpled the enemy's line from the Kovel-Sarny railway line to Bukovina, driving them back an average of fifteen miles.

In the Lutsk sector the Russians appear to have completely broken through, turning the left flank of the Austrian army and the right flank of the German forces and capturing Lutsk, the centre of a number of radiating roads and railways. At several points the attacking Russians have crossed the Ikva and Stry Rivers and further south they crossed the Strypa River and reached the Zlota Lipa, 60 miles into Austrian Galicia.

Whole Units Cut Off.

AUSTRIANS RECEIVE HELP; NEW ATTACKS IN ITALY RESULT

Italians Withdraw to New Positions to Escape Fire.

SHELLING IS INCESSANT

Battle Continues With Violence on the Plateau of Sette Comuni.

ROME, via London, June 9.—8:02 p.m.—The official communication issued by the war office today follows:

"In the Adige valley there has been an artillery duel, our fire causing fires and explosions in the munitions depots at Aughebene and Val Arsa. On the Posina-Astico front on the evening of the 8th, the Austrians, after an attack between Santabaldo and Volo Astico commenced an attack toward Monte Giove and Monte Brazzone, and were promptly dispersed by the accurate fire of our artillery."

"The battle continues with extreme violence on the plateau of Sette Comuni. On Wednesday evening an attack on our positions east of the Campomulo valley continued desperately until 11 o'clock at night. Our infantry killed a large number of the enemy."

"Enemy reinforcements."

"During yesterday the enemy having received enormous reinforcements renewed its attacks in the zone east of Asiago and east of the Campomulo valley after intense bombardment by numerous batteries. Our Alpine troops and infantry repeatedly repulsed the enemy columns, counter-attacking them bravely with the bayonet. At the close of the day our troops, in order to better sustain the incessant fire of the enemy's artillery withdrew to new positions some hundred metres further to the east."

"In the Sugana valley there was an artillery action. We made favorable attacks in the Podestagno zone, in the upper Boite and on the Reinzena."

"In the Carnia and Isonzo zones there were artillery and bombing exchanges."

HALF GREEK ARMY DOFFS THE UNIFORM ON ALLIES' ORDER

Constantine's Plans Balked by Energetic Measures.

PEOPLE ARE GRATIFIED

Effect Likely to Strengthen the Party of Ex-Premier Venizelos.

PARIS, June 9.—4:45 a.m.—The demobilization of the Greek army, which was signed yesterday by King Constantine, is regarded here as the direct outcome of the energetic measures by the allied governments recently taken in making joint representations to King Constantine, followed by an embargo virtually closing Greek ports.

The demobilization of twelve classes of the army means the sending back to civil life of 150,000 men, exactly half of the army, ordinarily composed of 24 classes.

The demobilization has been unpopular from the outset with the Greek people, owing to its harmful economic effects, and this is considered to have further influenced the taking of the step as well as the fact that the Government hopes that to give a large number of supporters of Former-Premier Venizelos in the army who desire to recover their civil rights.

The Entente Allies told the Greek Government that as a result of its negotiations with Bulgaria and Germany, they would take all measures necessary to enforce the treaties safeguarding Greek unity. The Greek commander of the port of Saloniki has been replaced by a French naval officer, and entry to the port has been refused to Greek ships.

Reports from Athens say the people are rejoicing over the demobilization. It is not thought the present Government can continue in power.

TWO KILLED IN TORONTO

TORONTO, June 9.—Two fatal accidents occurred this evening in the city. A. H. Colley, 145 Dupont street, an employee of the Lake Shore Ice Company, while working on the top of the ice pans in the artificial ice plant, was instantly killed by contact with an electric cable carrying a heavy current.

Harry Jessop was crushed by a pile of lumber at the corner of Keele street and Howard Park avenue, receiving injury to the head from which he died an hour later.

LIEBKNECHT'S TRIAL TO BEGIN IN FEW DAYS

AMSTERDAM, June 9.—Via London, June 10.—1:09 a.m.—A dispatch received here from Berlin says that Dr. Karl Liebknecht, the Socialist leader, who has been in custody since May 1, when he was arrested in connection with the May Day demonstration, is accused of treason, and that his trial probably will begin within a few days before the military court.

JAPAN IS SENDING BATTALION TO PEKING

Withdrawing Troops From Dairen Near Port Arthur.

TOKIO, June 10.—1:03 a.m.—Japan is augmenting her troops at Tien-Tsin and Peking by one battalion, which was withdrawn from Dairen, on the Liao-Tung Peninsula, near Port Arthur.

A dispatch from London Thursday gave a report from Tien-Tsin that American troops at that place had been ordered to hold themselves in readiness to proceed to Peking. The dispatch added that French troops from Annam had been sent to Peking. The troop movements probably indicate an apprehension of disturbances from the death of President Yuan Shih-Kai.
