

Elgin-Norfolk Liberals Stand For Low Tariff :: Police Seek Cowardly Motorist

LIBERALS TO BACK PARTY ON TARIFF

Promise Support to Premier King or Robert Forke in Election.

Liberals and Progressives of Elgin-Norfolk county are clear in their attitude toward the tariff question. At a meeting held yesterday in Battersby house, Simcoe, a resolution was unanimously passed favoring a low tariff candidate to represent the riding in the coming federal election.

This resolution, which was moved by Neal Newman, and seconded by O. H. Duncombe, is as follows:

"That this meeting expresses its approval of the nomination of a low tariff candidate to contest the riding of Elgin-Norfolk in the coming dominion election.

"That to this end a convention representative of all low tariff electors of the riding be called to make the said nomination.

"That the said candidate when elected is pledged to give independent support to and join the caucus of whichever low tariff party may be in power whether it be under the leadership of Mr. King or Mr. Forke.

W. M. GRAINGER UNFIT TO MAKE WILL, IS CLAIM

George Grainger Asks Supreme Court To Set Aside Brother's Document.

Claiming that undue influence was used in getting his brother, William M. Grainger, of Lambton county, to make his will in favor of his sister, Louisa E. Bailey, of Niagara Falls, George Grainger, also of Niagara Falls, is asking the supreme court of Ontario to declare the will null and void and to substitute a former will in which the deceased left his property to him.

Mr. Grainger in his statement of claim states that his brother William was confined to the Ontario hospital here for some time and that he was not in a mental condition to make the will. He claims that he was the one who looked after his brother during his last illness.

The defendants claim that no influence was used on Mr. Grainger and that the will was made by him in his last will and testament.

ment, of which \$42,890 would be provided for out of the tax rate. If five-year debentures are issued to build the new buildings this year's estimates will go to \$37,340.

Separate School.

A tax rate of 10 mills is expected by the Roman Catholic separate school board from separate school ratepayers. Assessment for this purpose is estimated at \$478,815, and \$47,880 expenditure is desired by the board.

Parks Department.

An appropriation of \$44,500 is requested for the city parks department, and the playgrounds division of the P. U. C. is after \$23,500.

Fire Chief.

Fire Chief John Atken is seeking a \$15,000 switchboard and a \$15,000 triple combination pumper. These requests will swell the fire department estimates to \$182,975.59.

Item Remains.

Estimates for industrial propaganda have not been changed from 1924, and the \$2,500 item of last year remains for this purpose.

Engineer's Charges.

Engineer's department estimates for 1925 are \$151,439, which represents the regular cost of overhead and maintenance and construction, and is charged to the general tax rate.

Highway Bill.

Outstanding in the preliminary draft of No. 1 omnibus estimates is a \$905,742.79 item for arrears in provincial highways account, a bill which must be paid, provincial authorities say.

BEGGARS REAP IN SHADOW OF LONDON'S FINE HOMES

Queen's Avenue, Gay in Summer, Is Winter's Street of Despair.

HAUNT OF HOMELESS

Background of Luxury Accentuates Misery of "Down and Outs."

Queen's avenue, in summer one of the city's proudest thoroughfares, in winter the avenue of despair. It is the haunt of the homeless, the luckless. At night dim figures meet up with the passerby with the plaintive cry, "The price of a meal, Bo." "A cup of coffee, I haven't eaten since . . ."

The price of a meal is produced. They are the barometers of the northern winter. Each year sees them thin and shivering near the corners, halting the working world homeward bound.

Queen's avenue, between Richmond and Wellington streets, is the spot most frequented by the down and outs, by the boys, and even women, looking for a handout. A few of them work Dufferin avenue, but Queen's avenue is the more renowned. The fact remains, the out-of-work "krab off the price of a sinker and a cup of java."

Whether the most generous people walk along Queen's avenue or whether the shivering forms of the homeless look more helpless with a background of fine homes, is not known, but the fact remains, the out-of-work apparently find Queen's the best street.

Last night one of them stopped a man who was going to the public library to get a book. Ten cents would buy a cup of coffee and a doughnut. Away he went. Ten minutes afterward the donor was returning toward Richmond street and the same man, with the same whine, asked for the price of a cup of coffee. A little later, an arithmetic on the part of the man who parted with the dime told him that twelve pennies, such as he would give the "krab off the price of a sinker and a cup of java."

During the cold snap of a few days ago a respectable looking woman, about 40 years of age, stopped a man just near a stage entrance to a theatre on Queen's avenue. She did not ask for money. She simply said that she had no food in the house. She was given 50 cents to get something to eat. She did not give her address, where further donations could be received. Inquiry at local charities proved that the woman had been helped, and that she had the food and clothes given her. She was not so badly off as she looked when in the shadows of the big houses on Queen's avenue.

Boat Faces Many Perils In Third Attempt On Lake

According to reports received in Port Stanley, the car ferry Bessemer, the second, with a large shipload of soft coal for manufacturers in Western Ontario, is experiencing a difficult time crossing the lake with her cargo.

"She was reported to have left Conneaut harbor yesterday at 2 p.m., but no sight of the steel ship has been seen from this port yet," said W. H. McPherson of Port Stanley, who is agent for the Bessemer, this morning.

Mr. McPherson also stated that there was a slight wind blowing across the lake this morning, which would hinder her progress somewhat. He said that with the same weather conditions and a large amount of dynamite used, she will make the harbor at Port Stanley late tonight.

Fishermen at Port Stanley have seen the Bessemer make her initial trip of the season for years report that it is a perilous job to navigate the lake at this time of the year. They say that she will likely use her propeller to advantage when arriving in the harbor to clear the ice.

The beacon on the lighthouse has been lit so that the Bessemer crew will be able to find their way should they come in during the night. The foghorn will also be set in operation this evening, it is thought.

The Bessemer has thus far made two attempts to cross Lake Erie. On Tuesday last she slipped out from the Conneaut dock, but, arriving about a mile from that port, she was wedged in by the ice floes and had to dynamite her way back.

Then on Thursday she attempted to make a second attempt, but was again wedged in by the ice. Port Burwell, when the heavy ice forced her back.

GRAYDON BACKS JUVENILE COURT

Relieves Condition, Magistrate Says—Mayor Wenige Is Enthusiastic.

YEAR A SUCCESS

Mayor G. A. Wenige is enthusiastically in favor of the juvenile court, while the attitude of Magistrate A. H. M. Graydon toward the court is one of tolerant neutrality.

Despite the attacks made upon it by J. M. Donahue, Rev. G. Q. Warner, judge of the court, declined to comment upon Mr. Donahue's charges, considering, presumably, that they were not worth answering.

The magistrate observed that he had his hands full at the present time and that he would be able to take over the juvenile court only on the same basis as prior to the time the juvenile court was created.

"While I always handled the juvenile court work legitimately before," remarked Mr. Graydon, "I could not handle the number they have now."

Greatly Relieved.

"I am greatly relieved that there is a juvenile court, and if the public want it, let them have it," he said. "As to my opinion whether the juvenile court was trying cases it should not, Mr. Graydon intimated that he did not know whether such was the case or not."

"Is the juvenile court doing efficient work?"

"I have no comment to make as to that," concluded Mr. Graydon, "nor have I any criticism to offer of the work of the court."

Mayor Wenige expressed the belief that the juvenile court is necessary, and that it is justifying its existence.

Because of the additional work put upon the court by the increased maintenance act, the mayor admitted that he was not opposed to a salary for the judge of the court, except that the salary should not be permitted to become an elaborate affair.

Praised by Mayor.

The mayor spoke in highly complimentary terms of the work of the court in connection with non-support cases, in which connection the court gathered in \$985 last year, which sum otherwise would have come out of the city coffers.

"After all," said the mayor, "the court is doing a good job. The situation must naturally be improved. The youngsters go wrong because their parents fail to look after them, and if the juvenile court keeps an eye on the parents, the situation must naturally be improved."

"The juvenile court is not really a court," pursued the mayor, "it is not a place for the administration of cold justice. The judge there is not dealing with criminals. It should rather be called delinquent headquarters, because the children are only delinquents, not criminals."

The purpose of the juvenile court was to keep the children away from the police court," concluded Mayor Wenige, "and therefore to maintain that purpose the court must retain its identity absolutely separate from the police court."
