For all of Canada it does not amount to more per head of the population than \$3.50 per annum. With its greater responsibilities the federal authority requires more money than the provincial

authority, but the disparity is too great in favor of the latter.

There is, again, the view which the Gazette lays so much stress upon, the spending of money, and the effect felt in the way of taxation. The provinces, if they exceed their limit, must resort to direct taxation, which is always distasteful. The Dominion raises its revenue entirely by indirect taxation, although it has the right to resort to direct taxation in extremity. We know

though it has the right to resort to direct taxation in extremity. We know that during the past ten years, through prosperity, there has been abounding revenue, with large surpluses, which has kept pace with the most lavish expenditure Canada ever experienced, and yet no share of the immense jump in revenue has gone back to the coffers of the provinces, which helped by their expenditure to create the prosperity, notwithstanding that their responsibilities have steadily increased with the increase of population. If it be right that there should be a check upon expenditure by the provinces, there should also be a check upon the extravagance of the Dominion. Millions of dollars are being squandered right and left by the federal authorities on all sorts of schemes, and
